

#### FR JULIAN WRITES...

August is a time when people start going on holiday, particularly those whose time is determined by school holidays. I remember family holidays on the north coast of Cornwall as a child, and my excitement at the thought of moving there. Sadly, life then wasn't one long holiday!

We live at a time when everything seems to be getting faster and more demanding. The rate of change has never been constant, and increases dramatically today. Many cannot keep up the pace, and suffer as a result. Greater pressure is put on all staff to improve productivity, increase annual profits, and to work unsocial hours. Many 'high fliers' burn out at an early age, others increasingly suffer from well-being and mental health issues. We are all being pushed to the limit, clergy as well.

As we have heard recently in the gospel readings last month, Jesus sent out the twelve disciples to preach, heal and to cast out demons – everything that he himself did. When they returned, presumably tired out but pumped up with adrenalin, they reported all that they had done. I can imagine them clustering around Jesus with each pair clamouring to give their reports.

And Jesus' response? 'Come away by yourselves to an isolated place and rest awhile.' Jesus knew what human fatigue was like, and he knew the limits of the human body. He himself would go to a deserted place to pray and to have time to rest, so it is not surprising that in his compassion and understanding of the human condition, that he should urge his disciples to have some 'me time' and to take care of their physical selves, so that they may be refreshed to resume their ministry with him.

Visiting people in hospital, I'm often told that one of the more trying things is sleeping. Not just an unfamiliar bed, but others around, strange noises, lights and movement. People can't wait to get home and 'get a good night's sleep' which is a vital part of the healing process. If we are physically tired than we just cannot function properly. Suffering from Long Covid, I know this all too well.

As well as our physical selves, we also need to take care of our spiritual selves: that's just as important. To 'come away for a while' might involve a retreat or a pilgrimage, but again Jesus says that we can be spiritually refreshed by going into a room, closing the door and praying to the Father, free from distractions. We need to have 'me time' spiritually as well as physically.

A rule of life is often the way in which we can begin to take charge of our spiritual selves. Just as we have routines about eating and sleeping, what we do and when and with whom, so we need to have the same disciplines (the same word as disciple) about our inner lives. That is why it is so important to be aware, just as we know when we're tired or hungry, of the spiritual needs we might have.

Regular prayer or meditation — set prayers such as at morning or evening (all available online) or just a few minutes' silence, are ways which we can regain control, if we think things are getting out of hand or pushed to one side. Also, a place set aside for prayer: a cross or a candle or a statue or an icon on a shelf can constitute that 'inner room' of which Jesus speaks. And of course coming together to be fed with word and sacrament is the most effective way of being spiritually refreshed.

Not everyone can get away on holiday. But we can, and must, all make time for ourselves, and look after ourselves, so we can function better, and more happily.

#### **AUGUST SAINTS** – Fr Julian's idiosyncratic selection of saints

**2nd: St Eusebius of Vercelli** (283-371) St Eusebius was a Sardinian bishop who was one of the key players in the fight against Arianism, a heresy which denied the divinity of Christ, along with the better-known Athanasius.

**5th: St Oswald** (c. 604- 641/2) Oswald was the King of Northumbria



who united the two northern kingdoms of Bernicia and Deira, bringing Christianity to the kingdom. What we know of his life is through the Venerable Bede. He was killed in battle by a pagan, who in turn was killed by Oswald's brother, who strengthened the Christian ethos.

**8th: St Dominic** (1170-1221) was a Castilian Catholic priest and the founder of the Dominican Order. He is the patron saint of astronomers and natural scientists, and he and his order are traditionally credited with spreading and popularizing the rosary.

**10th: St Laurence** (225-258) St Laurence was one of the seven deacons of the city of Rome under Pope Sixtus II who were martyred in the persecution of the Christians that the Roman Emperor Valerian ordered in 258. As there is no 'w' in Latin, he is correctly spelt with a 'u' – of course...!

SAINT

**14th: St Maximilian Kolbe** (1894-1941) Maximilian Kolbe was a Polish



Catholic priest and Conventual Franciscan friar who volunteered to die in place of a man named Franciszek Gajowniczek in the German death camp of Auschwitz, located in German-occupied Poland during World War II. He is the patron saint of amateur radio operators, drug addicts, political prisoners, families, journalists, and prisoners.

**20th: St Bernard** (1090-1153) St Bernard of Clairvaux was an abbot, mystic, co-founder of the Knights Templar, and a major leader in the reformation of the Benedictine Order through the emerging Cistercian Order.



## Spotlight on...



#### **Richard Tomlinson**

This month we find out a little more about Richard Tomlinson, our very own intrepid traveller and Electoral Roll Secretary.



Hi Richard, it is lovely to be talking to you today, tell me, how long have you lived in Taunton and what did you do for a living?

I was born in Greenford near Ealing but in 1949 my father obtained a post as a teacher in Northern Rhodesia so we moved there, this was the only time I was in the same school as my father. We were there for three years and then returned to Ealing where father then taught in East London. We moved to South Woodford which is on the border of London/Essex but then came back to Ealing once again.

I worked for the Co-op Union, which became Co-ops UK. We managed the affairs of all the Co-ops not only shops but the housing and other co-operatives. The HO was in Manchester but I was based in London and my role was to advise on government legislation going through Parliament and how it would effect the individual co-operatives.

I retired in 1995 and twelve years later I came to a funeral in Taunton where the wake was held at County Ground. Spending three nights at the Corner House Hotel, I walked around getting to know the area and something seemed to stick. Whilst looking for a show flat I had heard about, I came across a postman and asked for directions. He directed me here and I was so impressed I bought it and am still here 16 years later. It is a lovely mixture of modern and industrial and right beside the cricket ground — what could be better?

What do you do in your spare time, what are your hobbies? Well, for 6 months of the year I have my cricket. I did play at school but not much after that. I did help out with the Scouts cricket team but that was in more of an organisational capacity. For the other six months I enjoy travelling. My favourite place is Cyprus.

Why do you like Cyprus so much?

... because they drive on the right (left to us) side of the road! Ha ha that's funny I'm going to put that in.

I spy some trophies over there do you want to tell me about those? Twenty five years ago and long before I came to Taunton, I took up lawn bowls. My trophies range from 2001 to 2006. Gosh you didn't miss a year! Ealing was a small club but here in Taunton I joined Taunton Bowling Club based in Vivary Park. A much bigger and busier club.

What would you say is important to you and what does your faith and Holy Trinity mean to you?

Family and Church are important to me. I first found Holy Trinity when I moved to Taunton in 2008. It was Maundy Thursday and I was looking for somewhere to go on Easter Sunday. I popped into St James and St Mary's but when having looked at a house in Church Street, I saw Holy Trinity. It was Holy Saturday and the door was open, so I went in. There was a man leaning against the back pew and we got talking. It turned out that he was the Vicar (out of uniform) and I felt so welcome that I knew Trinity was the place I would stay. The people here are so friendly and welcoming. I grew up in a Church going family and I have never known anything else. It is important to have a faith and to practice that.

Thank you Richard, it has been lovely talking to you today thank you for seeing me, it is lovely to hear people's stories, we all have something to say.

#### A RECIPE FOR AUGUST

#### QUICHE NORMANDE

#### Ingredients

Ready made shortcrust pastry
2 medium onions, sliced
1 tbl olive oil
7 tbl water
3½ oz bacon, chopped
1 x 250g Camembert (Le Rustique is good)



#### Method

- Preheat oven at 180° C.
- Stew the onions in a pan with the olive oil and water over a low heat until the onions soften. Strain off the liquid.
- At the same time in a frying pan cook the bacon for 5 minutes until golden brown.
- Cut a circle of pastry slightly larger than the camembert and place on a baking tray.
- Slice the camembert in half horizontally and place one half on the pastry rind side down. Cover with onions and most of the bacon. Place the other half of camembert, rind side down, on top.
- Mould the pastry around the edge of the cheese and scatter over remaining bacon.
- ➤ Bake for 40 minutes or until pastry is cooked. Leave to cool and share with friends.

# RETURN TO THE FALKLAND ISLANDS 8 -17 May 2024 Part 2

In last month's Outlook Gervas wrote of his role in the Falklands during the Falklands War, Part 2 now looks at his recent return visit.

The main purpose of our visit to the Falkland Islands was to dedicate a memorial at Ajax Bay, the main logistics base during the war in 1982, to the 6 who were killed and the 30 or so wounded when the base was bombed on 27 May 1982 by Argentinean Skyhawk aircraft. The base was known as the Beach Support Area and was manned by the Commando Logistic Regiment Royal Marines; within it, was situated

the Field Hospital, later to become known as the Red and Green Life Machine. Having received the appropriate clearances from the Commonwealth War Grave Commission, Falkland Islands government and the landowner, a former Royal Marine, now living on the islands, built this fantastic memorial.

We had tried on 3 previous occasions in 2021, 2022 and 2023 to get down to the Falkland Islands to dedicate this memorial so this was 4th time lucky! Our party consisted of 5 veterans of the war including me,

all of whom had been at Ajax Bay when it was bombed and 2 of whom had been wounded and 3 serving members of the Commando Logistic Regiment. The dedication service took place on Monday 13 May 2024 and was attended by the Deputy Governor (the Governor was in the UK), representatives of the Falkland Islands government, several local people and our party of 8. The

service was conducted by the Reverend Steven Jones who was a 17 year old Royal Marine in 1982 and is now the Rector of Exmouth Coastal Churches (Exmouth, Littleham and Lympstone).

There were many other activities that we carried out during our all too brief visit of which 4 stand out:

We attended Mass at Stanley Cathedral on Sunday 12 May which was conducted by the Rector, The Reverend Hayley Argles Grant. It was a lovely occasion at which we received the warmest of welcomes. It was the first occasion I had attended a service at Stanley Cathedral since the Thanksgiving Service in 1982 a few days after the end of the war.

- Laying wreaths at the Stanley War Memorial on behalf of my boss,
   Brigadier Julian Thompson and visiting the Commonwealth War Graves cemetery at Blue Beach, San Carlos.
- Touring Government House and having tea with the Deputy Governor.
- Visiting Yorke Bay and Cape Pembroke and seeing many hundreds of penguins (mainly Gentoos), sea lions and seals. The wildlife was fantastic although we were told that the winter months are not the best time to see it.

All in all it was a truly memorable visit, only my 2nd such visit since the war. To see how the Falkland Islands population has grown, the extraordinary improvements in the infrastructure, the expansion of tourism and the stable economy were remarkable. Above all I will remember how welcoming the local Falkland Islands people were to us, the veterans. Once we were identified as veterans of the war, everyone without exception warmly welcomed us and thanked us for what we had done in 1982. It was incredibly humbling.'
